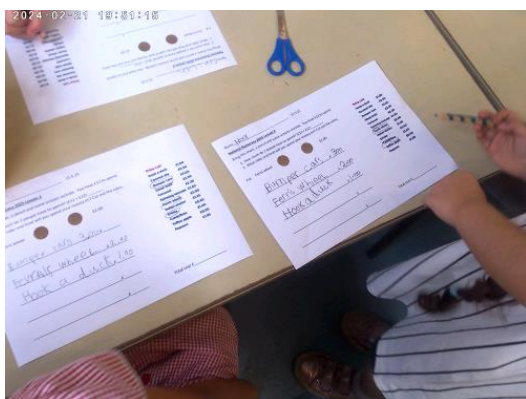

Message from our Governors:

Governors at Farnham Common Village Schools.

The governing board of the Village schools consists of members of the school leadership, elected parents, and others from the community (known as co-opted governors). The role of the governor is to work with the school leadership to set the school's strategic direction, ensure high quality education, oversee the budget, and hold the head teacher accountable.

We have vacancies on the governing board for new parent governors, and this will require an election. Nominations are open now and close on Thursday, June 5th. More details can be found in the attached letter from the Head Teacher.

There are many reasons to volunteer to be a parent governor, and these can include making a difference to the local community, improving the lives of the children who attend the school, ensure voices are heard. It can be a rewarding experience, and for those looking for skills development can help build professional skills, and develop leadership skills.

We are also looking for a new Chair of the governing board as the current co-chairs' term is ending this academic year in August. We need a new Chair in place in September, and if you know anyone who would be interested, please contact us.

School Development:

In the future we will be sharing how we have and will be developing our schools through a half termly communication. In preparation for that time, our main priorities for next half term are continued training of staff in the teaching of phonics, with particular focus on Year 3 and SEND, transitions for all year groups, celebrating achievements we have had over the academic year, reporting attainment and progress of children and making sure we are ready for September, especially for Acorn Pre-School and Wrap Around Care.
