

Spelling Activities

Choose an activity from this sheet to help your child learn their spelling words. Try to choose different activities each week to keep spelling fun!

<h2>Magnetic Letters</h2> <p>Spell the words using magnetic letters, wooden letters, letter cards or letter tiles.</p> 	<p>Spell the word out loud using letter names. You could say it quietly, shout it, sing it, rap it or use a funny voice.</p>  <h2>Sing it or say it</h2>	<h2>Rainbow Writing</h2>  <p>Write your words in one colour then write them again over the top in another colour. Repeat until each letter looks like a rainbow!</p>
<p>Write the word on the ground outside using chalk or water and paintbrushes.</p>  <h2>Paint and Chalk</h2>	<h2>Look, Cover, Write, Check.</h2> <p>Write the words on cards and say how to spell the words. Cover the words and write them down. Check to see if you spelt them correctly.</p>	<p>Bounce or catch a ball as you spell out each word. Can you keep bouncing until you have spelt all your words?</p>  <h2>Bounce it</h2>
<h2>Playdough Words</h2> <p>Use alphabet cutters or make letters to spell your words using playdough.</p> 	<p>Fill a baking tray with paint, shaving foam, sand or flour. Practise writing your spelling words with your finger.</p>  <h2>Finger Writing</h2>	<h2>Build It</h2> <p>Make the spelling words using pipe-cleaners, or write each letter on a sticker and put them onto Lego bricks to build the words.</p> 
<p>Play a spelling game – number your spelling words 1-6. Roll a dice and spell the word that matches the number you roll.</p>  <h2>Spelling Games</h2>	<h2>Silly Sentences</h2> <p>Write each word in a sentence or a silly sentence. Don't forget a full stop and capital letter.</p> 	<p>Play a game of hangman with your spelling words. Who will get the most right?</p>  <h2>Hangman</h2>
